

New archaeological prospection studies marble archaeological pieces in France

A group of ArPA-LIRA researchers is undertaking archaeological prospection works in a wooded area in central France to document quarries that could have been exploited in Roman times.

Marie-Claire Savin, Andrea Collado and Jordi Oliver, members of the ICAC's Unit for Archaeometric Studies (UEA), have traveled to the areas of Nièvre and Alier (France) to document some quarries that could have been exploited in Roman times.

Through this, the team will obtain valuable information to determine the characteristics of the marble in the area and thus be able to establish the origin of the archaeological pieces and, also, the area of distribution of the different varieties documented in the area.
